


<p>Abilities</p> 	<p>The skills that someone has</p>
<p>Academic Adjustments</p> 	<p>Changes how a student participates in class and completes assignments in order to give them equal access</p>
<p>Accommodations</p> 	<p>A change made to the way an assignment is completed or how an environment is accessed in order to provide support to a student (Examples: equipment, extra time, flexible schedules, building access)</p>
<p>Accommodation Letter</p> 	<p>A letter that is given to professors that explains the accommodations the student is approved to receive</p>

<p>Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA)</p> 	<p>A law that guarantees rights for a person with a disability</p>
<p>Admission Requirements</p> 	<p>The skills needed in order to be accepted into a college</p>
<p>Advisor</p> 	<p>An employee at a college that helps students choose courses and plan for their future career</p>
<p>Agressive Communication</p> 	<p>Expressing thoughts and feelings in a disrespectful and forceful way without listening to the opinions of others</p>
<p>Appointment</p> 	<p>An agreement to meet someone in-person, on the phone, or virtually at a specific time</p>

<p>Assertive Communication</p> 	<p>Expressing thoughts and feelings in a respectful, open, and confident way while listening to the opinions of others</p>
<p>Barrier</p> 	<p>Obstacle a person faces</p>
<p>Certification</p> 	<p>Documentation a person receives that shows they have the certain skills needed for a specific job</p>
<p>College</p> 	<p>A place where students go after high school to continue their education so that they can earn a degree or certificate for their chosen career</p>
<p>Community College</p> 	<p>A place where students go after high school to continue their education usually in order to receive 2-year degrees and/or specific job skill training</p>


<p>Casual</p> 	<p>When a person behaves in a relaxed way</p>
<p>Communicate</p> 	<p>To give or receive information through talking, listening, body language, or written formats like emails</p>
<p>Confidential</p> 	<p>Private</p>
<p>Disability Disclosure</p> 	<p>When a person tells someone that they have a disability and describes how it impacts them</p>
<p>Disability Services</p> 	<p>Protects students from discrimination and makes sure they have the supports and accommodations they qualify for so that they have equal access</p>






<p>Documentation</p> 	<p>A record of information</p>
<p>Educational Performance</p> 	<p>How a person does in school including grades, attendance, and participation</p>
<p>Effective Communication</p> 	<p>Expressing thoughts and sharing information in a clear and respectful way while being an active listener</p>
<p>Employee</p> 	<p>A person who is being paid for doing a job</p>
<p>Employer</p> 	<p>A person or company that pays people for working and doing a specific job</p>






<p>Equal Access</p> 	<p>The right to have the same opportunities</p>
<p>Expectations</p> 	<p>Beliefs that something will happen</p>
<p>Higher Education</p> 	<p>Education after high school, also called postsecondary education</p>
<p>Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA)</p> 	<p>A law that requires each student get a free public education and receive special services if they need them</p>
<p>Individualized Education Program (IEP)</p> 	<p>A program that identifies your disability, your strengths, your needs and challenges, and the services your high school will provide for you</p>













<h3>Informed Decision</h3> 	<p>A choice made based on what you have learned and know</p>
<h3>Interests</h3> 	<p>Something that a person enjoys</p>
<h3>Interview</h3> 	<p>A meeting between an employer and job applicant</p>
<h3>Job Application</h3> 	<p>A form that a person applying for a job fills out so that the employer can learn about the person</p>
<h3>Job Requirement</h3> 	<p>Skills necessary for a certain position</p>

<p>Job Shadow</p> 	<p>When a student goes to a workplace and follows an employee so they can learn about a specific position's responsibilities</p>
<p>Lecture</p> 	<p>A talk that a professor or teacher gives to teach students about a topic</p>
<p>Modifications</p> 	<p>Changes that are made</p>
<p>Need</p> 	<p>Something that is necessary and important</p>
<p>Outcome</p> 	<p>The end result</p>






<p>Office Hours</p> 	<p>Time that a professor keeps open to meet with students</p>
<p>Passive Communication</p> 	<p>Avoids expressing thoughts or feelings and lacks confidence to stand up for rights, needs, or wants</p>
<p>Permission</p> 	<p>To be given approval to do something</p>
<p>Personal Information</p> 	<p>Facts about a person</p>
<p>P.I.N.S.</p> 	<p>An acronym that stands for Preferences, Interests, Needs and Strengths, which are all important for finding a career that is a good fit</p>

<p>Poor Communication</p> 	<p>When thoughts or information that is being shared is unspecific, unclear, or disrespectful</p>
<p>Portfolio</p> 	<p>A collection of documents or projects that represent a person's skills or accomplishments</p>
<p>Postsecondary Education</p> 	<p>Education after high school, also called higher education</p>
<p>Pre-Employment Transition Services (Pre-ETS)</p> 	<p>Services for high school students with disabilities that help prepare them for a job or postsecondary education</p>
<p>Pre-Employment Transition Services Providers (Pre-ETS Providers)</p> 	<p>Instructs students ages 14-22 to prepare them for the transition from high school to career path which could include postsecondary education, training, or employment</p>

<p>Preference</p> 	<p>Taking action or preparing for a situation ahead of time</p>
<p>Proactive</p> 	<p>Process of preparing students for reaching goals after high school</p>
<p>Professor</p> 	<p>A teacher in a college or other postsecondary setting</p>
<p>Professional</p> 	<p>When a person behaves in a positive, respectful, and reliable way</p>
<p>Pros and Cons</p> 	<p>Thinking about the advantages and disadvantages to help you make a decision</p>

<h3>Psychological Report</h3> 	<p>Includes testing results and information about someone's behavior and capabilities, while explaining the way they learn best and how a disability may impact their learning</p>
<h3>Reasonable Accommodations</h3> 	<p>Any change to an assignment or classroom that helps a person with a disability understand the content and access the learning space</p>
<h3>Research</h3> 	<p>Gathering information on a topic</p>
<h3>Responsibilities</h3> 	<p>Things that you are expected to do</p>
<h3>Resume</h3> 	<p>A document that outlines a person's educational background, work experience, and skills</p>

<h3>Rights</h3> 	<p>Legal protections that cannot be taken away</p>
<h3>Section 504</h3> 	<p>A law that prevents disability discrimination and allows students to receive accommodations</p>
<h3>Self-Advocacy</h3> 	<p>When a person is able to stand up for their rights, needs, and wants</p>
<h3>Strengths</h3> 	<p>Skills or tasks that a person does well</p>
<h3>Student Services</h3> 	<p>A department at a college that supports students with their academic, social, and living needs</p>

<p>Supports</p> 	<p>Trainings or assistance that already exist in the workplace to help people with disabilities</p>
<p>Technical College</p> 	<p>A place where students go after high school to continue their education, usually provide certificates and specific job skill training</p>
<p>Transition</p> 	<p>Process of preparing students for reaching goals after high school</p>
<p>University</p> 	<p>A place where students go after high school to continue their education, usually provides a 4-year degree</p>
<p>Visual Checklist</p> 	<p>Pictures of tasks in order of when they need to be completed</p>
