Organizations that provide specific services and supports

College Fair



An event with admission counselors from colleges and universities that are often located at high schools and allow students to ask questions and gather information

Community College



A college that provides students the opportunity to continue their education usually in order to receive 2-year degrees and/or specific job skill training

Counseling







A professional who gives you advise or helps you with personal, social, or psychological problems

Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)



A federal government form that students complete to get financial aid to help pay for college



<p>High School Counselor</p> 	<p>Professional who helps students find their educational path and achieve their post-high school goals</p>
<p>Mobility</p> 	<p>The ability to move freely</p>
<p>Postsecondary Education</p> 	<p>Education after high school, also called higher education</p>
<p>Pre-ETS Provider</p> 	<p>A person who instructs students ages 14-22 to prepare for the transition from high school to a career path which could include postsecondary education, training, or employment</p>
