What are Community Resource Maps?

Community resource maps are tools to help you:

- Find resources in your community
 - **Resources** provide you with services and information to support you
 - **Resources** can be websites, people, or agencies
- Keep track of **resources** in your community
- Get from one place to another



How Can Community Resources Help You Continue Your Education?

Community resource maps can help you:

- Keep track of college and training programs you are interested in
- Find college or training program **resources**
- Save important information such as your class schedule, phone numbers, and addresses

What Types of Resources Can Be Added to Your Community Resource Map?

Types of **resources** that can help you reach your goals after high school:

- Advocacy and disability rights:
 - Assists you in advocating and learning about your rights
- Employment:
 - Assists you with getting a job
- Family support:
 - Helps you be healthy and safe in your community
- Independent living:
 - Helps you with finding housing and support for living on your own
- Postsecondary education:
 - Assists you in continuing your education
- Recreation:
 - Helps you find activities you enjoy and can participate in



How Do You Know Which Resources to Add to Your Community Resource Map?

- Search for **resources** before you leave high school
- Keep track of the places you visit in your community
- Ask your support system about **resources** that could be helpful for you when you leave high school

- Who the resources or agencies help
- How the resources or agencies can help you
- Address
- Phone number
- Website
- Cost
- Any additional information helpful to you
