



Questions to Ask Students Example Form

There are a variety of topics providers and teachers should discuss during their initial meetings. It is important to use the information gathered in the meeting to guide lesson planning and instructional approaches for the students you are working with. Below is an example of information you may gather from your pre-planning meeting and how to organize it using the Pre-Planning Form.

Example: Mrs. Davies is a Pre-ETS Provider at Mountain High School. In order to learn more about each of her students, Mrs. Davies decides it would be a good idea to meet one-on-one with each of them. Mrs. Davies should ask the following questions about each student's PINS:

1. **Preferences:** What types of environments do you feel comfortable working or learning in?
2. **Interests:** What do you like to do outside of school? Do you have any careers you are interested in?
3. **Needs:** What are some of the things that you need to help you succeed?
4. **Strengths:** What are some things that you are really good at? What are your favorite things about yourself?
5. **Other:** What are your short- and long-term goals? Is there anything else I should know?
