

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Reality Check #1



Transition should NOT be a service added to the end of a student's high school career.

Transition training should begin at a young age and is an ongoing opportunity for students to learn and practice responsibility and self-knowledge.



Reality Check #2



Too often students are taught dependence, passivity, and reliance on unseen forces to take care of them.

No one has a greater stake in the outcome of transition planning than the student!
